Our club was established in 1969, only 10 miles of trails existed. Over almost 50 years the trail system has grown to 59 miles of trails. These trails are cleared, signed and insured by our club. Hours of labor, gallons of fuel and thousands of dollars for liability insurance is usually covered by the trail fund ticket donations, memberships, and other fundraisers that we are able to pull together. However, over the years there have been many changes, especially the last several years with little to no snow. Membership has declined along with the support of the local businesses. We have found ourselves in need of much more support! We realize everyone is very busy, with kids in sports, jobs and life in general but we all have life going on. The president and handful of board members are asking for any and all help this season. It is very difficult for us to manage everything.

The Clubhouse and trail upkeep, fundraisers-fish fry's (in February), racing events, and serving breakfast and lunch on the weekends when there is rideable snow.

Due to serious washouts that occurred this spring and summer, some of the trails are completely impassable. The expense for equipment rental and the manpower hours of help are needed to fix the trails.

We reached out to the following local merchants and they have stepped up to help with donations, Laurelwood Inn & Steak House, Howards Inc, Fezz's Diner and Millstream Inn, but manpower is still needed to help with the rest of the trail system. 4 or 5 ppl isn't enough, we need your helping hands to help clear and sign a major part of the trail system for this season. So mark your calendars for Sundays November 18th and December 2nd to help YOUR club get YOUR trails ready for this riding season. Everyone willing to help should meet at the club house at 8:30am.

If this doesn't happen there will be parts of the Potter County Trail System that will not be available to ride this winter and possibly lost going forward.

Please step up and don't let the history of the Potter County Snowmobile Club diminish. We want to keep this beautiful place going. Far too many years of hard work and dedication should not go to waste.
